

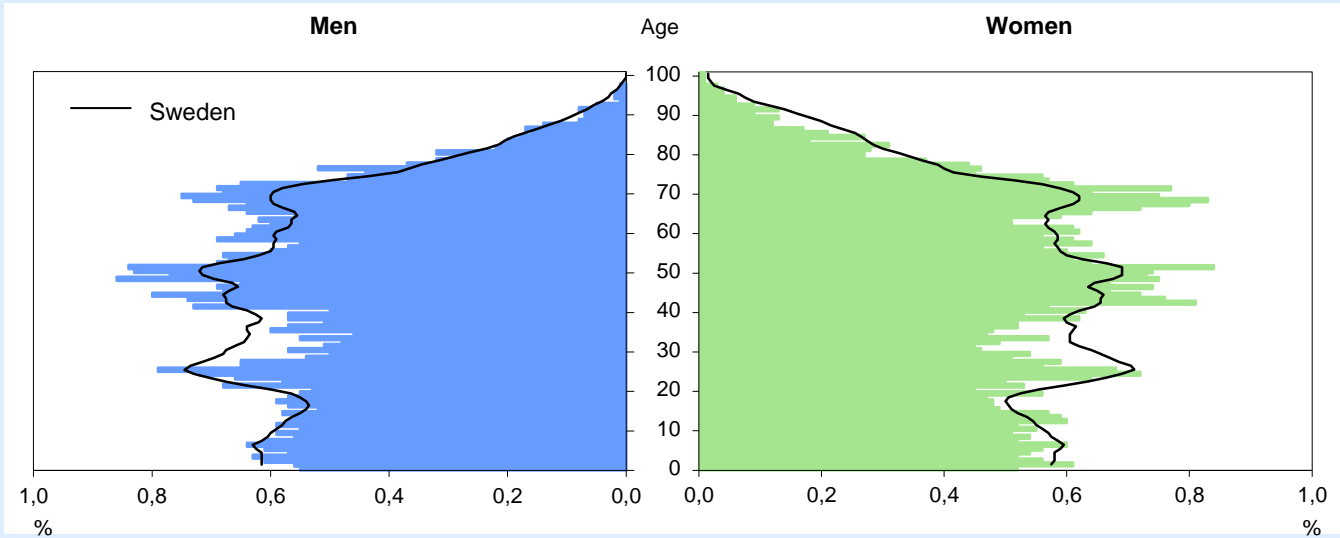

## Population by age, 2015



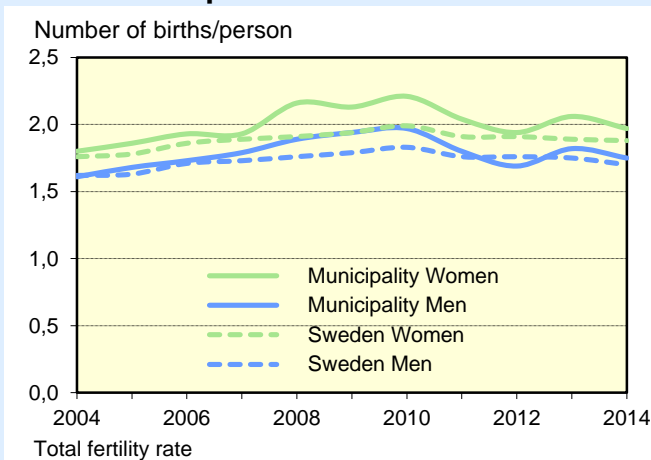

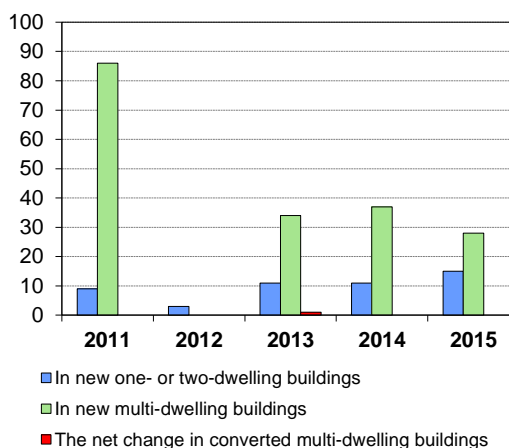

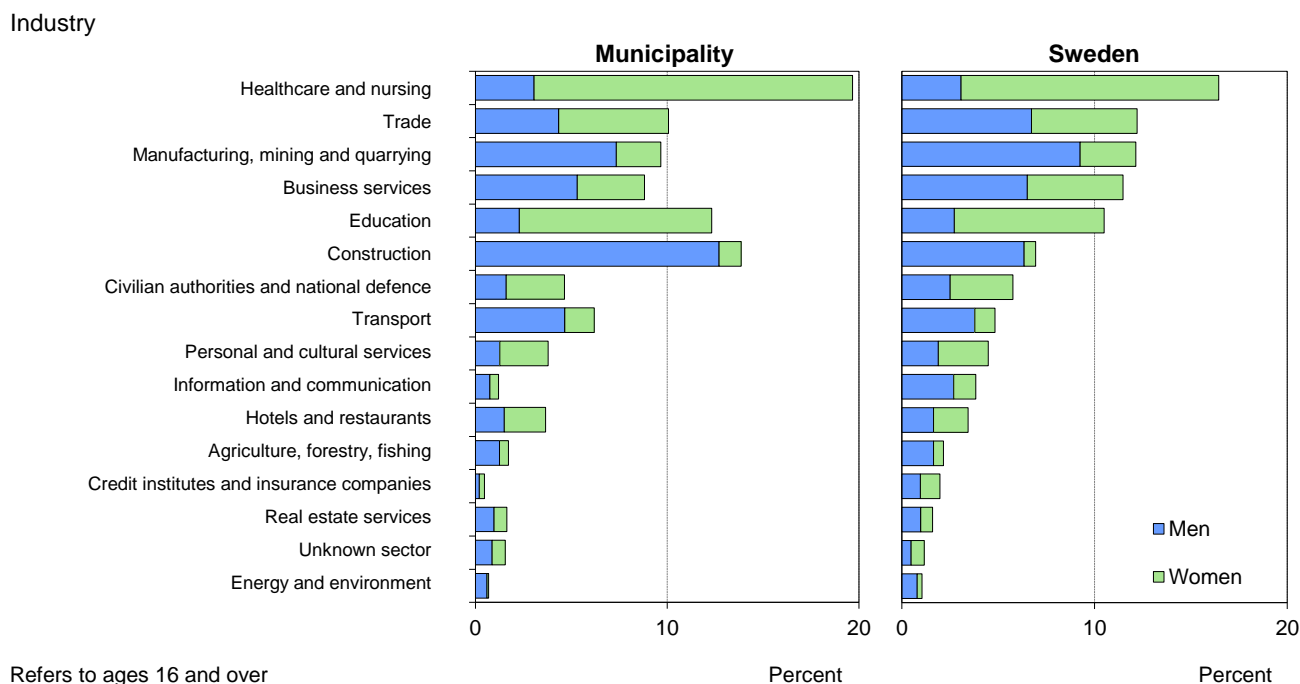

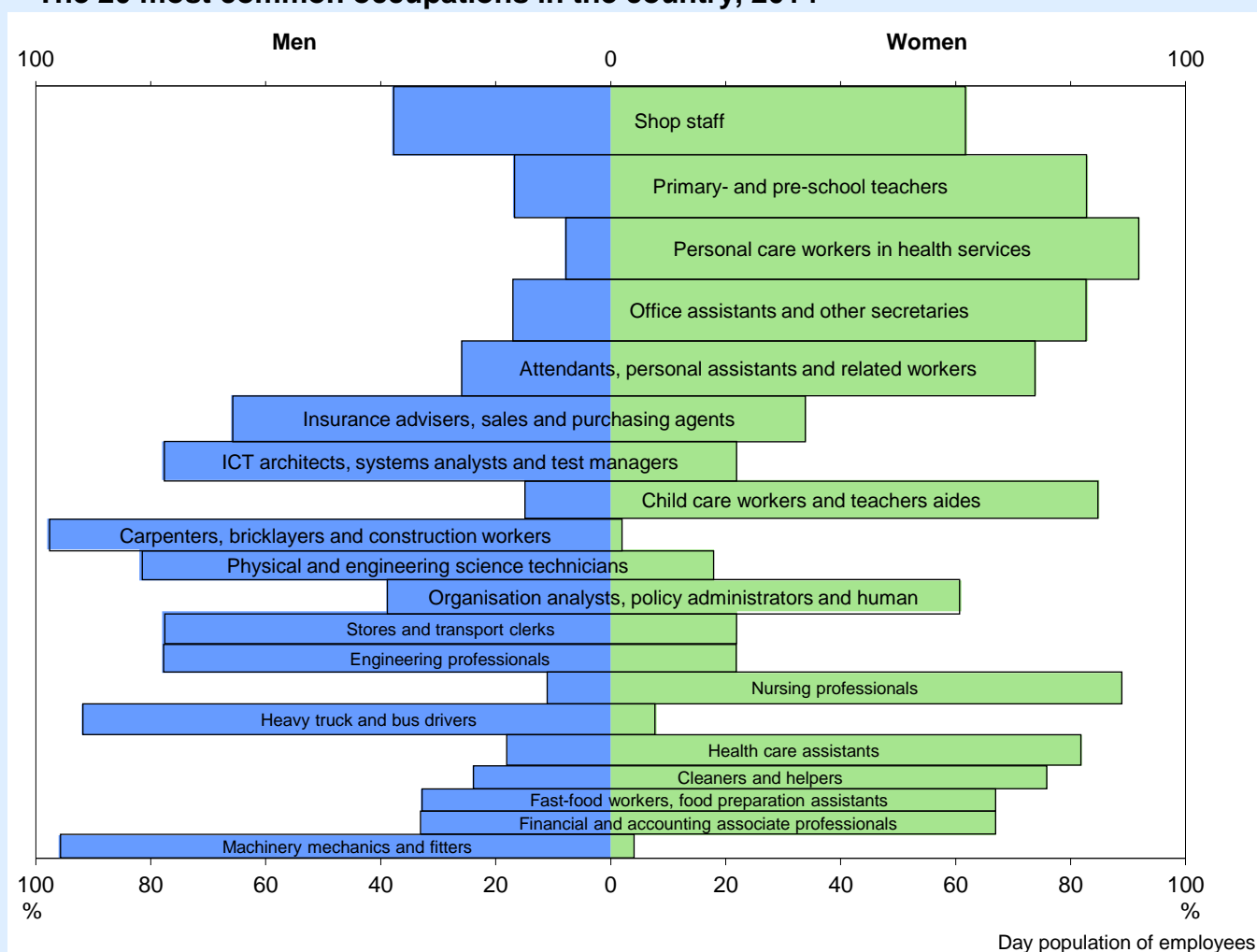

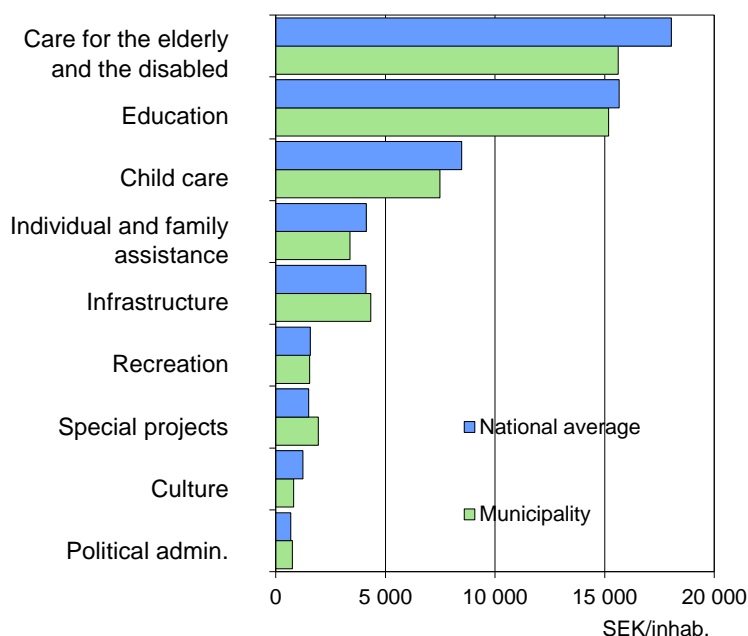
