Nynäshamn on the move



Prime Minister Göran Persson and Director General Ingemar Skogö of the Swedish Road Administration participated in turning the first shovel of earth for the construction of the new motorway.

It takes just over a half hour by car to reach the municipality of Nynäshamn from Stockholm. The municipality has a population of slightly less than 25,000 but boasts 1,852 islands and islets.

The small municipality of Nynäshamn is conveniently close to Sweden’s capital city. Being small provides a sense of security and close distances to nearly everything. You can easily commute by bicycle to work without grappling with cars and buses. The municipality has an upper-secondary school and primary schools, with after-school activities, located in all parts of Nynäshamn. There are secondary schools in Nynäshamn, Ösmo and Sorunda, all popular small communities a short distance from Stockholm.

In Nynäshamn, it is still possible for people with average incomes to purchase their own homes. Despite the fact that half of the residents live in one-family houses,

there remains plenty of space for additional housing.

The business sector in Nynäshamn is rapidly expanding and some 900 companies are already established there. The municipality is dedicated to creating the best conditions for small businesses to thrive. Its Business Assistance Bureau provides guidance and answers all enquiries.

Nynäshamn is now growing closer to Stockholm. The main route is being extended to a four-lane motorway. This will spur additional investment from new businesses as well as ensure a continued favourable environment for residents.

Equally important is the expansion of the Nynäs commuter line to a double track standard. Not only will the increased capacity benefit commuters, it will also allow additional rail freight transportation. The Government has assigned the Swedish Rail Authority to examine how the rail line can be improved and a decision is expected shortly.

The Stockholm Region needs a new deep-sea port and it is generally expected that the port will be located at Nynäshamn. Presently, large container vessels experience difficulties in navigating through the narrow passages in the Stockholm archipelago. There are no such obstacles at Nynäshamn. With the new motorway and the expanded rail goods can easily and efficiently be shipped on to business and three million consumers in the immediate region.

Over the coming decade, Nynäshamn will experience exciting developments. With an improved communications infrastructure, the municipality can benefit from many of the metropolitan region’s advantages – without having to bear its disadvantages.

The Municipality of Nynäshamn

The municipality has a total population of nearly 25,000. Slightly more than 13,000 live in the town of Nynäshamn and other population centres are Sorunda, Stora Vika and Ösmo.

The distance to Stockholm is approximately 50 kilometres, to Arlanda Airport 100 kilometres and to Södertälje 45 kilometres. By road, it presently takes 35–50 minutes to reach the southern Stockholm city gate. The commuter train to Stockholm Central Station takes one hour.

The municipality provides good-quality services for all ages. Services include housing for the elderly, day-care centres and schools.

Nynäshamn offers schools specialising in nature as well as a cultural and music school.

The municipal tax rate is SEK 19.83 per SEK 100 in earnings. Total tax is approximately SEK 32.30 per SEK in earnings.
